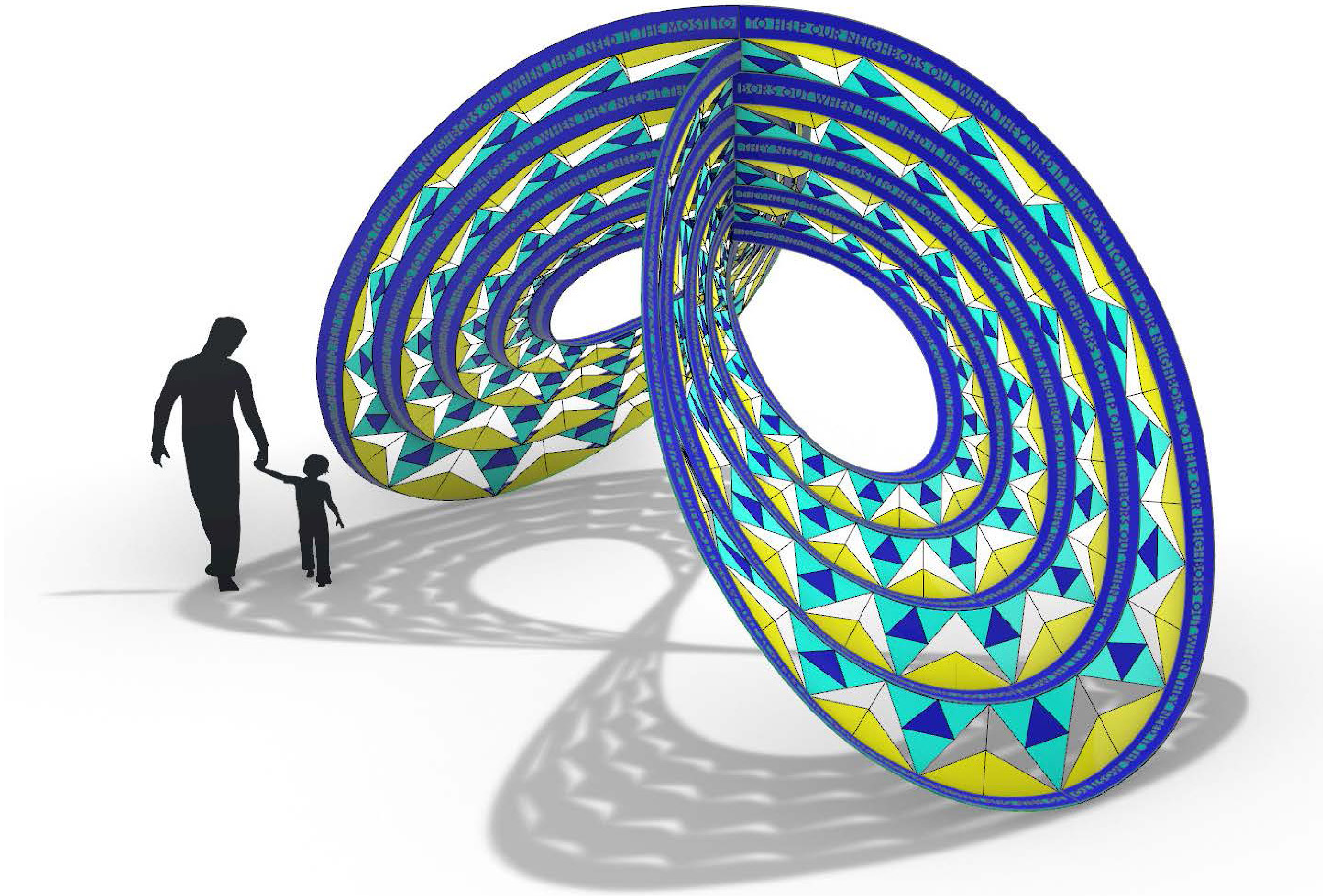
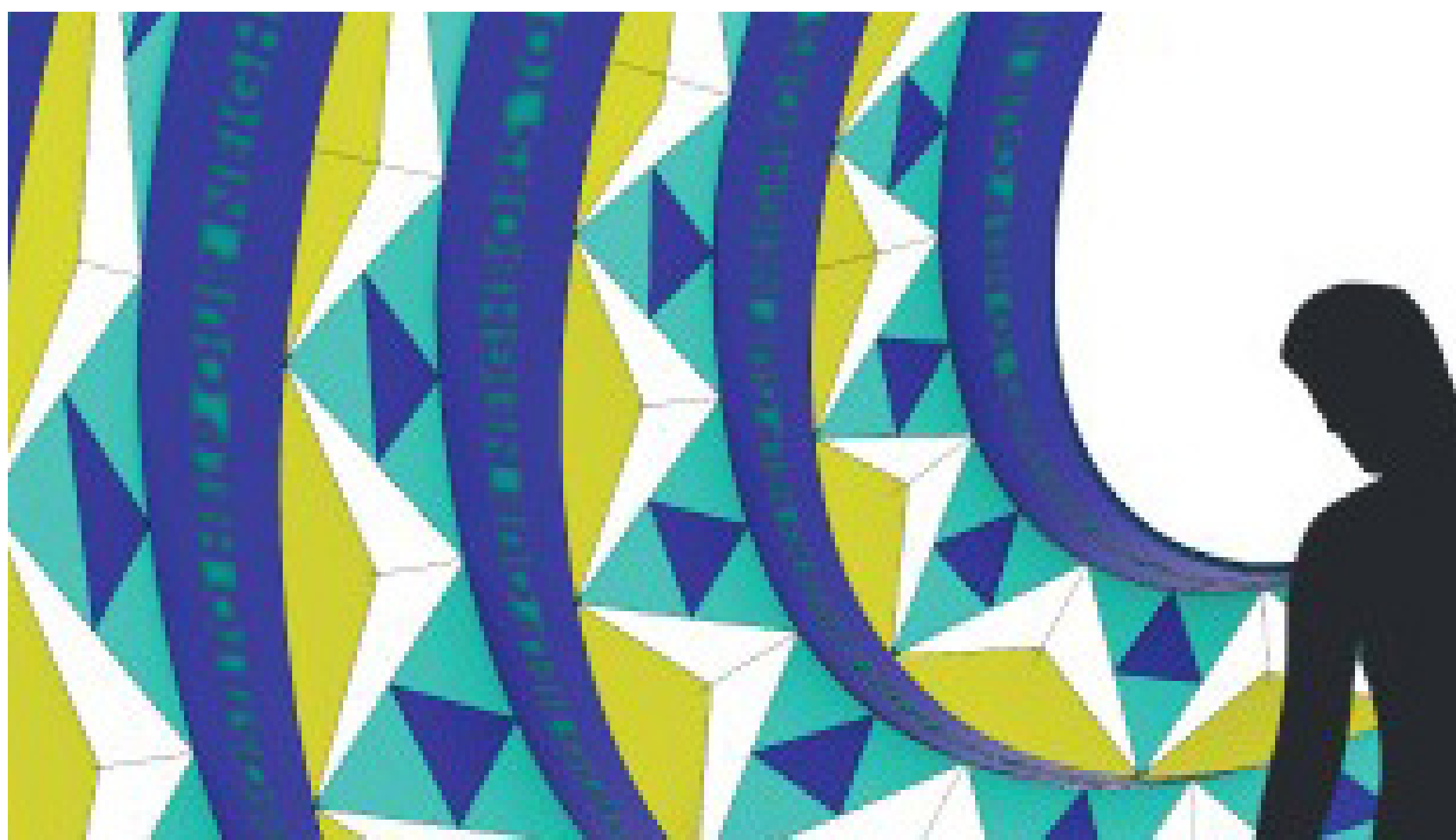


Sycamore Park Public Art Project By Blessing Hancock



This colorful sculpture is inspired by the park's natural environment and recreational activity, and the families that gather there. A series of curvilinear bands come together to create a figure-eight-like form representative of community, and creative play. The metal surface combines a triangle pattern and linear text collected from the local community to create a cohesive storyline and educational opportunity. The sculpture will become an energetic pulse for the site and the community it serves.



A visual landmark for Sycamore Park, the artwork is designed to stand 12 feet in height, 18 feet in length and 10 feet in width. Shadows from the triangle and text patterns will be a prominent feature during the day and offer interactivity as you move around and through it. At night the canopy will softly illuminate creating a welcoming glow. It will be located near the playground off Vickery Boulevard.
