PROJECT NAME: BLUE BONNET CIRCLE
PRESENTATION: Approve Project Outline for public art in Blue Bonnet Circle, 76109 (Council District 9)



The City of Fort Worth has completed pavement improvements around Blue Bonnet Circle as part of the City of Fort Worth's 2022 Bond Program. Blue Bonnet Circle Park within the large roundabout has a master plan on file which was designed in 2007; though there is currently not a timeline for implementation, the public art project will be cognizant of the concepts. Similarly, the Park and Recreation Department recently added pedestrian lighting through the park from a separate improvement fund. The area receives traffic from many nearby neighborhoods as well as regular foot traffic in and around the park, therefore it was identified in the *Fort Worth Public Art Plan for the 2022 Bond Program* as an impactful location for public art.

PUBLIC ART SITE AND APPROACH

This public art project provides an opportunity for an artist to create unique artwork(s) in and around Blue Bonnet Circle Park. The Project Core Team will meet to discuss goals for the project (date forthcoming).

PUBLIC ART BUDGET

This project is included in the *Fort Worth Public Art Fiscal Year 2026 Annual Work Plan*, adopted by the Fort Worth City Council on December 9, 2025, as M&C 25-1127. A total artist's budget of \$544,050.00 was included in the *Public Art Plan for the 2022 Bond Program*.

ELIGIBILITY

Staff will recommend 6-8 artists from the *Fort Worth Public Art Pre-Qualified List of Established Artists* whose work would be a good fit for the project.

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ARTIST SELECTION PROCESS

SELECTION PANEL MEETING #1

FWPA staff shall present a pool of 6-8 candidates. Artists will be contacted prior to being considered by the Artist Selection Panel, to ascertain their interest and availability. The Artist Selection Panel shall review the artists' previous work and qualifications and select 3 finalists and one alternate.

FINALIST ORIENTATION

The finalists shall participate in an orientation for the project which will include a virtual walk through of the site.

SELECTION PANEL MEETING #2

The Artist Selection Panel shall interview each of the three artists individually. The Panel may then ask questions about their professional experience and related work. The Panel will then recommend one artist and one alternate for the project. Upon the FWAC's approval of the Panel's recommendation, a Preliminary Design contract will be executed with the selected artist.

PROJECT SUMMARY

- The Fort Worth Art Commission (FWAC) approved the Gateway Park Public Art Project Outline on August 19, 2024
- The FWAC approved Trevor O'Tool as the artist for Gateway Park on December 19, 2024
- The artist was placed under a Preliminary Design Contract on March 14, 2025 (CSC #62960)
- The artist conducted a site visit and met with the Project Core Team and City staff for input prior to beginning concept development on June 4, 2025
- The artist met virtually with the Project Core Team and presented four concepts for input on September 29, 2025, and subsequently chose one to develop in Preliminary Design
- The FWAC approved the artist's Preliminary Design on December 15, 2025
- The artist was placed under a Final Design Addendum on May 27, 2026

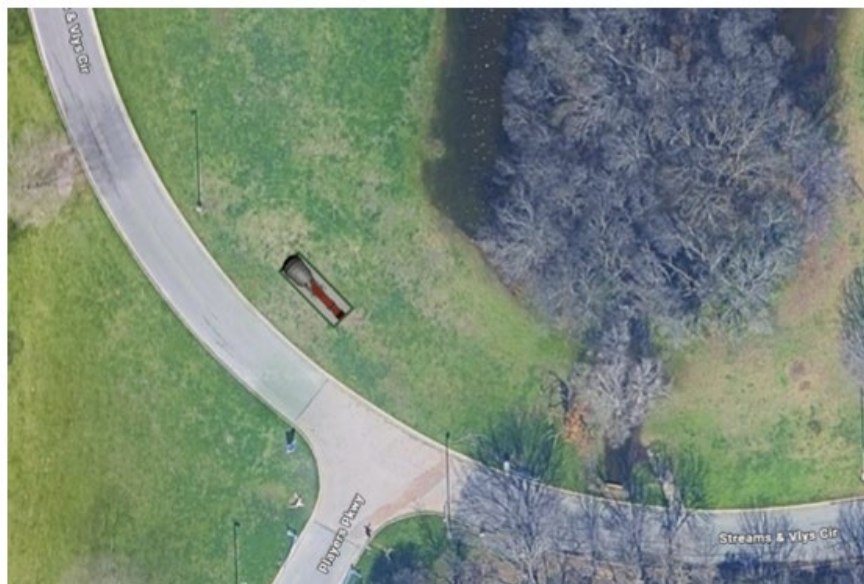
STAFF RECOMMENDATION

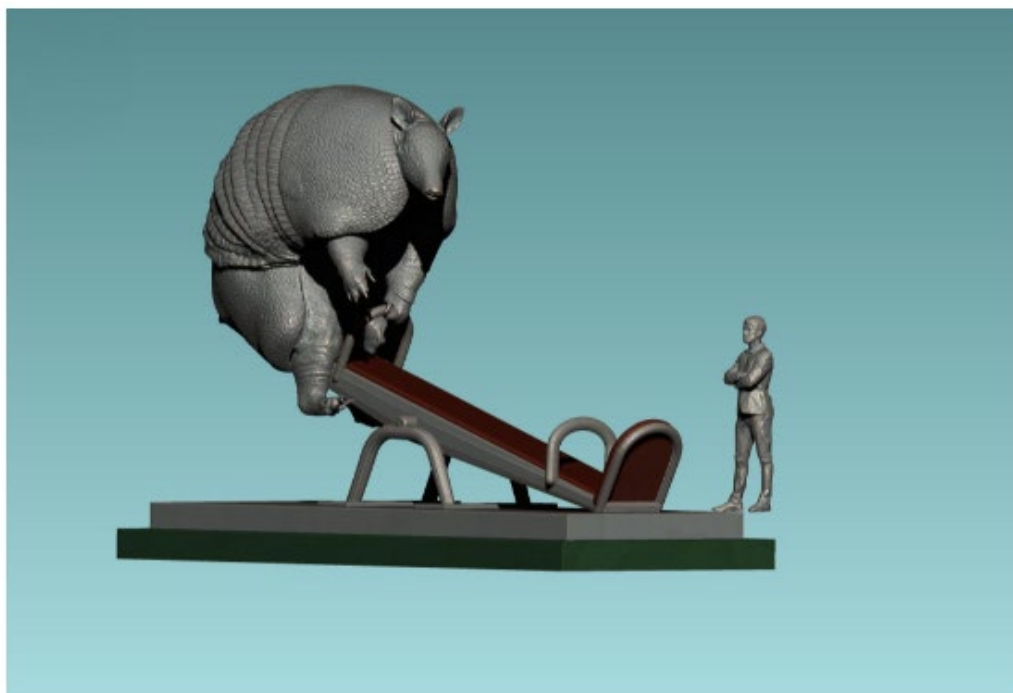

ACTION ITEM: Approve Artist Final Design for public art in Gateway Park, 76111 (Council District 11)

For the Gateway Park Public Art Project, Trevor O'Tool has designed a playful oversized armadillo astride a large see saw, apparently held aloft by an unseen companion on the other end. The artwork engages visitors to the park with its approachableness, humor and larger than life quality. While signage will instruct visitors not to climb the artwork, it invites all nimble enough to take a seat and a selfie.

The artwork's subject speaks to a gentle, suburban animal so many are familiar with, while also taking part in the play and recreation themes that are central to the park, without celebrating a particular sport or user group, something cited as important by the Project Core Team. The artwork's location adjacent to Streams and Valley Circle Drive and disc golf will make it readily visible and accessible to drivers and pedestrians.

The armadillo will be fabricated by the artist using a clay modeling and lost was process. Cast in sections in bronze, it will be welded, smoothed and patinaed prior to transport and installation. The see saw will be fabricated in stainless steel and skinned in polycarbonate or a similar material to keep the bench from being too hot to touch in the summer. The artist has engineered the see saw and the support structure to withstand the weight of the armadillo and guests sitting on the bench. The pedestal base is designed to accommodate being in a flood plain.

The artist will share further details of the Final Design during their presentation at the Fort Worth Art Commission meeting on Monday, September 21, 2026.

- The artist held a design input meeting on August 19, 2026, with the Fort Worth Fire Department, Project Core Team members, and other project stakeholders.

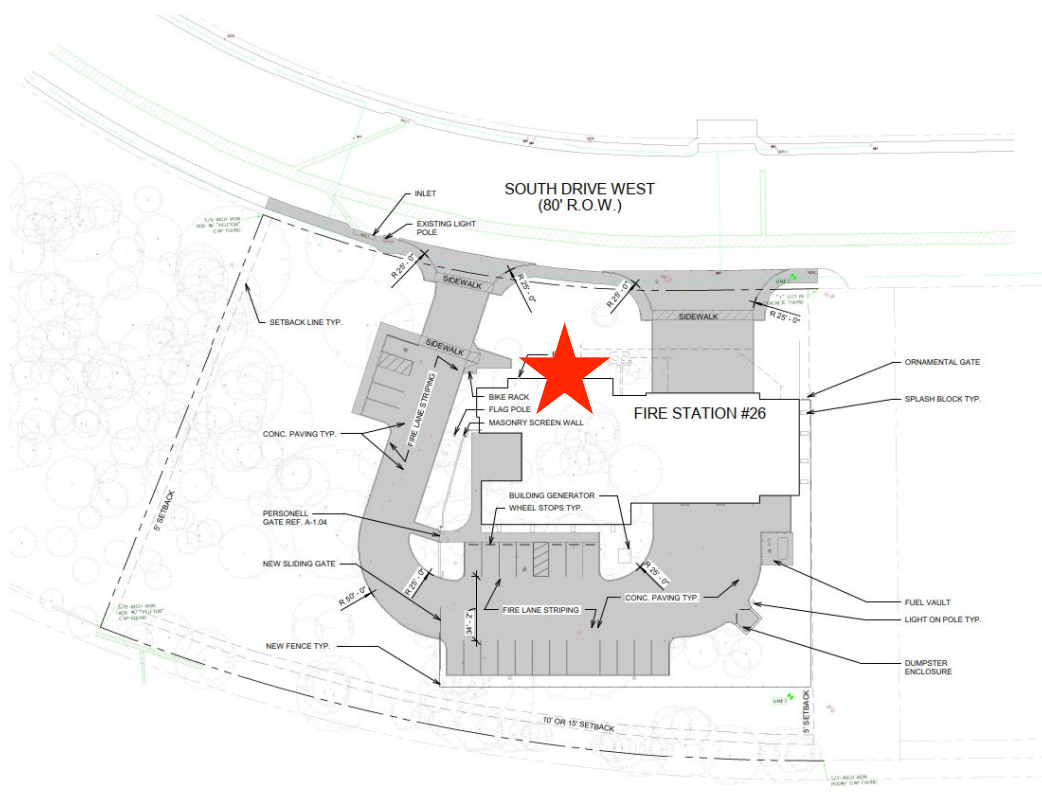
STAFF RECOMMENDATION

FINAL DESIGN PREVIEW



Quilting is a practice of care, preservation, and shared history; these creations are often passed down from generation to generation, preserving stories. *Stitched In Service* utilizes this historic medium to create civic unity while conceptually “wrapping” Fire Station #26 protectively. Numerous artist-designed icons will populate the quilt, to be completed by community members and “stitched” together, a symbol of the connection between firefighters and the community they serve. Centered in the quilt are three firefighters, representative of the three Cs of Ventilation (communication, coordination and control), along with a Maltese Cross. The design is intended to celebrate connection and create a vibrant, inclusive artwork.
